Step 1: Set aside an hour of your time. Call 211 (24/7). Wait times may vary

Step 2: Select the Homeless Hotline prompt. Say that you are homeless and in Morris County which

Step 3: Answer the assessment questions in their entirety and truthfully to be appropriately assessed for

Step 4: The 211 screener will link you to some immediate resources in the county based on your situation. Morris County housing and shelter providers will contact you directly as program openings occur, or will request more information about your current situation to best assist you in accessing resources, shelter and/or housing services.
